If a number of cats are involved in the problem behaviours please try and give details of them all – the reverse of each page can be used for information about

additional individuals.

Detail •	Is about the household: Who else lives with you and this cat? Please list all the family members and their ages.
•	What experience have you and your family had in the past with cats?
•	Has the family composition changed while the cat has been living with you? If so how?
•	Do all members of the family interact with the cat? Does the cat have a preference for one person? If they do like one member of the family particularly how do you know this?
•	What other animals live with you? Please list them with details of their type, breed, age and sex.
•	Have they all been present throughout this cat's life with you? If not please indicate when they arrived in the household.

 Do all the animals get on with each other? Please indicate any particular friendships or rivalries. For example, does the cat sleep with or groom any of the other animals, and how do they greet each other?

Details about the house and household routine:

Your house

- Is your house in an urban or rural setting?
- Does your cat have access to outside? If they do go outside is this allowed all the time? When is access restricted? Is access through a cat flap?
- If the cat does go outside how long do they tend to go out for over a 24 hour period? Are you aware of how far they go?
- Are there any other cats in the neighbourhood? Where do you see them?
- Does your cat meet with other cats outside? What happens when they meet?
- Do strange cats ever come, or have they ever been, in your house?
- Please draw a rough map of the house and the areas immediately surrounding the house. You need to indicate where your cat is allowed to go, where they are fed, where they normally rest or sleep, the positions of doors to the outside and any cat flaps, and the position of windows. If the cat uses a litter tray please include this in your plan.

Feeding

- Does your cat prefer to eat meals or feed little and often throughout the day?
- What does your cat eat? How much do you give?
- Do they have any other treats or tit-bits? What are these and how much do you give?
- Who usually feeds the cat?
- Where and when do they eat?
- What does your cat drink?
- Does your cat enjoy their food?

Sleeping

- Where does your cat sleep at night?
- Does your cat have access to all the house all the time? If not please indicate
 which areas they have access to and when.
- · Where does your cat rest during the day?

Toileting behaviour

- Does your cat use a litter tray? Do they have access to it all or just some of the time?
- Where is the litter tray in the house? How many trays do you put down?
- What litter do you use?
- How often do you clean out or empty the tray, and what do you clean it out with?
- Does your cat ever toilet or spray away from the tray inside the house? If this
 is not the primary problem please give brief details about these incidents.

Scratching

Does your cat have and use a scratching post in the house?

Does your cat scratch elsewhere inside? Do you see them scratching outside?

Play and interaction with people

- Does your cat play with you?
 What do you play? How long do you play each day?
- What toys does your cat have?
 Do they have a favourite toy? What is it?
- Does your cat play with other animals in the house?
 If so when, where and with whom?
- Does your cat sit on laps? Do they prefer one person in the house?
- Does your cat follow you about within the house?
- Does your cat 'talk' to you? At what other times do they miaow or call?
- Does your cat chew or suck your clothes? If so, what material do they prefer?
 Do they chew or suck any other materials?
- Does your cat let you groom him/her? How does your cat respond to being stroked or picked up?

Your cat's first days with you

- Where did you get your cat from?
- At what age was this?
- Did you meet any related cats? What were they like? Have you kept in touch with the breeder or owners of siblings to know if they too have problems?
- If your cat was a rescue do you know any details about their life before joining you?

• Ho	ow do you react when it is happening? How do you react afterwards?	
• W	here does it happen? Is this predictable?
